Recently I received an email from the Rotary Global History Fellowship indicating that they were celebrating, each month, a club from the "First 100" Clubs of Rotary List. There are only 4 clubs in all of Canada that precede The Rotary Club of Hamilton on that list, Winnipeg, Toronto, Vancouver and Halifax. Halifax was issued their charter on the same day and year and so precedes us only alphabetically on the list. So here we are continuing the celebration of our historic 100th Year during the 2013-14 Rotary year, a proud member of Rotary's First 100 sharing the place of the fourth club established in Canada with our friends in Halifax.

History is something we make every day. Our club continues to grow and to occupy a central role of service in the life of our city as it has done for all of those 100 years. Our work in the inner city, thanks to the foresight of club members, which preceded the Code Red series and the City's Neighbourhood Strategy by more than a decade or two, continues to make a significant difference in our inner city. Our work in literacy has positioned our club as a preeminent contributor to children's literacy in Hamilton. The Rotary Summer Literacy Program regularly serves as many 2,000 children each summer. The club has taken on the responsibility of working with a host of other clubs in delivering the annual Telling Tales Festival considered by many as the single most significant festival of its kind in all of Canada.

It is not just here in Hamilton that Rotary history continues to be made. It has been announced that the 2018 Rotary International Convention will be held in Toronto. This will be a wonderful opportunity for Rotarians from our club and district to attend a convention if they have not already. For those who have attended in the past they can attest to the experience of realizing just how much we are part of a movement much bigger than ourselves. Our club is looking at some ways in which we can be a significant part of this history making convention.

"Service above self" when embraced as a part of our daily lives can only serve to make our community a better place. May our next 100 years of service be as fruitful and as historic as our first.


