I'm very sorry I haven't been in contact with you recently, April was a whirlwind.

I just got back from a week in Rome, with my Latin class.

It was absolutely amazing. There were 12 of us, 9 kids and 3 teachers.

The small size was fantastic, as we got to see and do so much more than if we were trying to function in a large group. We went everywhere too - the Vatican, St. Peter's Basilica (including both dome and necropolis!), the Colosseum, the Forum, the Trevi Fountain... Absolutely amazing.

Coming back to Finland, this past week has been a crazy too. All week, the city was crowded with drunken university students with their coloured pants (showing what branch they're studying). This is because May 1 was "Vappu", a celebration for "spring and education", from what my friends and host family have been saying.

Basically, it's a chance to get really drunk and blow up balloons and eat donuts and drink "sima" (a non-alcoholic homemade mead from brown sugar and lemon juice, or at least that was the one I had). A few of my friends were going to various clubs meant for teens and "young adults". How did I spend it? Playing singstar with my host mom and sisters and their friends until midnight. I think my way much better :).

The weather in Finland is pretty messed up right now. All the snow and ice is finally gone, and the rivers are flowing once more. Everything is very brown though, and sort of depressing. We've been getting days of gorgeous sunshine, and days it's been raining really hard. May 1, it was actually snowing again! But even then, the sun is starting to set later and later - last night I went to bed at 11:30 pm and it was still sort of light out!

Good news - I've been emailing back and forth with Konsta quite a bit. He seems very nice and is very, very excited to come in August. I quite like talking with him, we've been conversing in Finnish. He says he understands what I say, but my grammar is terrible! I can definitely imagine that, as my grammar in English isn't much better most of the time.

Pioneers of Rotary – These vignettes showcase some of the contributions the men and women of the Rotary Club of Hamilton have made in the past century.

Reverend Crossly Hunter was President in 1940. As a Reverend of the First United Church, he achieved much success eventually becoming minister of Trinity United Church in Toronto.

What stands out in the life of this pioneer is his willingness to speak out against injustice during a time when many voices were silent.

An article in the Globe and Mail describes how Rev. Crossly Hunter spoke out at a rally to bring attention to the plight of the Jews after the pogroms of Kristallnacht. When many church and government leaders remained silent on this front, the Reverend did not.

During a rally of 20,000 he gained the loudest applause when he urged that Canada adopt an open door policy in dealing with the Jewish refugee problem. This pioneer's spirit reminds me of many of our contemporaries such as Chris Cutler and Matthew Greene.

Rotary Clubs are built not only through the donation of service and funds to the community but by the character and spirit of the members and the leadership they bring to our communities.

Through our willingness to speak out against injustice we help to build not only our club, but a city whose compass is aligned with the four way test.

How to get a Club Roster


Log into our Rotary Club of Hamilton's ClubRunner account

The easiest way to do this is to go to our website www.rotaryclubhamilton.ca and click on the link marked "ClubRunner" in the bottom left corner. (You should "bookmark" these two sites for future reference.)


Click on the "eDirectory Reports 2.0" option in the "My ClubRunner" section.
