World Community Service Committee

The final Rotary Summer Literacy report for summer 2012 shows that the program continues to be a success. In spite of costs related to challenges with staffing from the Board of Education, we managed to stay within budget. The program in 2012 saw several successes: average attendance per day was up; there were increased numbers from Cathy Wever School; parent engagement was stronger

and the Rotarian of the Day was greatly ppreciated by parents.

The program for 2013 is well in the planning stages and we are working to increase the brand awareness and success of the Rotary Summer Literacy Program.

The literacy programs at Cathy Wever School are moving forward with great success as 17 Rotarians are participating in the All Star Reading Program.

The Wever Hub has started an "Eye Sight" research project. It is with the support of the Hamilton Community Foundation and McMaster University and St Joseph's Hospital. The project is linked to literacy as without good eyesight many students have difficulty reading and learning.

A partnership with St Leonard's and the Hub will be launched in January. The first part was the donation of computers made during the Christmas Party. The second phase will be a computer repair clinic during the WAVE After School Program for youth and families. Computers can be repaired and fix or rebuilt at no cost.

Computer Problems A Thing Of The Past! F


Here's some exciting news from our partners in the community. The Wever Hub is partnering with the St. Leonard's Society of Hamilton on a unique program. St. Leonard's is a not-for-profit that has operated in Hamilton since 1972. In 2001, they launched the GreenBYTE **Computer Training** program. The program does three things. It collects computers and diverts them from landfill by

returning them to a good useable condition. It trains clients to fix and repair computers so they can gain well-paying, meaningful employment. And, it runs a small business enterprise that markets refurbished computers. They are interested in starting a computer repair program at WAVE for kids who are attending WAVE and/or live in the area. These kids would have computers that are

not working and they would like to get them repaired. The program would be free and repairs would be made and legal operating systems and virus software would be installed. More details will be available soon. Come to WAVE and watch for further information.
