



World Community Service

The World Community Service committee is pleased to report that the grant application entitled "Thrive for Five" was recently approved by Rotary International. Through the matching grant system, the Rotary Club of Hamilton's donation will be matched by a full 250% through the matching grant system. Thrive for Five will be administered by Project Muso in Mali; the aim of the program receiving funding is to provide early detection, diagnostic testing, and treatment for diseases with known cures in children under 5 years of age. The program will also ensure the training of community health workers to assist in providing these services in the homes of community members. Project Muso has documented (since the program's inception), the highest reduction of infant mortality rates yet recorded globally and the RCH has been a strong supporter for a number of years. It's wonderful to be a part of such a successful global project.
