


### Rotarians go back to school! Rotarian of the Day



The Rotary Club of Hamilton Mountain was chartered on October 17, 1975. Our sponsor at the time was the Rotary Club of Hamilton Mountain. We have come full circle with our June 30, 2019 merger with our original sponsor club to continue as The Rotary Club of Hamilton.

The 1970's were the heyday of Rotary expansion and 25 "charter members" founded the Mountain Club. Of those 25, three are still with us and continue as honourary members (Tony DiSilvestro, Earl Inglis and Ed Waldes). At its peak in the mid 1990's membership in the "Mountain Club" exceeded 75 members. We were the self-proclaimed "Rotary Club that the Others Look Up To" and our motto was "Fun, Fellowship and Fundraising". Like all Rotary Clubs the new millennium saw an ever-continuing decline in membership until with just 13 members this spring the remaining members made the bold decision that for Rotary to survive on the Mountain that a merger with the other Hamilton club was necessary. We were welcomed with open arms and we appreciate that. By merging, vs dissolving, the Mountain Club continues to exist in the new stronger merged club, everyone benefits. The majority of our active membership (10 of 13) are continuing their membership in the Hamilton Rotary Club. They are Paul Boschler, David Elliot, Judi Emerson, Clement Feierabend, Bilal Mirza, Peter Murray, Jay Parmar, Jim Thomson and Bruno Uggenti. The following past Rotarians were awarded honourary members for their meritorious and longtime service to Rotary: Lois Brabant, Brenda Campbell, Tony DiSilvestro, Earl Inglis and Ed Waldes.

Many of you will recall that the Mountain Club met for many years at the Hillcrest Banquet Centre on Concession Street with their fabulous smorgasbord, the best lunch in Rotary. When that venue closed we moved around a fair bit never staying long at a single location until the last few years where our final home was the Mall Road "Fortino's", Second Floor Community Room.

Over its 43-year life as a club, the Rotary Club of Hamilton Mountain served the mountain community in a myriad of ways.

- -Bingo was and continues to be a major fundraiser. At one time as may as 15 Rotarians were required to run each bingo. Now a bingo requires 3 Rotarians. Clement Feierabend and 2 others for an evening. We hope to continue this in the merged club
- -McQueston Park Clean Up: in recent years the Mountain Club adopted this large park on Upper Wentworth as a "hands on project" pursuant to the City's "Adopt a Park" program. For 5 lunches during the summer we meet for a short lunch under the picnic pavilion and then spend an hour cleaning the park using the City's trailer of supplies. We hope to continue this project. We note that there is no meeting on the first Thursday of each month and that would be the perfect time to keep this tradition alive. With that in mind we have already reserved the "trailer" for the first Thursday's of August, September and October.

Christmas Party & Turkey Roll (aka raffle): For as long as I've been in Rotary the Mountain Club has held a Christmas Party for its members, families and friends and in conjunction with this event we hold a raffle for frozen turkey's (and more recently Fortino's gift cards). We usually hold this at Michelangelo's in early December. It's very much a social and /con't

event and we raise a couple thousand dollars or so for local Rotary projects/ charities. Tickets are sold for the dinner in advance and its quite reasonable, approx. \$40 per person for the dinner. Attendance in recent years has been about 80. It is very much enjoyed, and we can have a discussion in the fall as to whether it is something that can continue.

Nevada Tickets: Another fund raiser we have is "Nevada Tickets" which are sold at a specific convenience store. This raises a thousand or so per year with minimal effort by the club. A project worth continuing.

Summer BBQ: A social fellow ship event that we've traditionally held is a summer bbg. This event is for Rotarians, spouses and families. In recent years this event would be held at a member's home, at Bruno's trailer on the Grand and in the case of last summer, at the RHYC along with our international Rotarian guests attending the RI convention.

Major Fundraiser: Historically the Mountain Club had a Major Fundraiser every year, being some sort of Gala Dinner and Auction that at its peak had attendance of several hundred and profits in the twenty-thousand-dollar range. Unfortunately, with declining membership it became impossible to continue this project and 2015 was the last year this event was held. Hamilton Mountain Citizen of the Year: Similarly, for many years the Mountain Club held a Mountain Citizen of the Year Award Dinner at which a deserving Hamilton Mountain resident and youth were awarded Paul Harris fellow. Again, declining membership doomed this event which was last held in the early part of this decade.

The Mountain Club used its fundraising efforts to support a myriad of local charities over the years with donations over our 43-year life exceeded several hundreds of thousands of dollars.

International Projects: Over the years we also made significant donations to International Projects, particularly to "eye sight" projects. Our most recent project was a joint one with the Rotary Club of Navsari, Gujarat, India for the purchase and operation of a mobile eye clinic to serve the poor villages of that part of India. Our donation of \$10,000.00 along with matching grants etc. supported a project that was almost \$100,000.00 in total!

We were a 100% club and included the \$100US Foundation donation amount in our clubs' annual dues.

The Rotary Club of Hamilton Mountain has a long history of service. We look forward to continuing that tradition in our new club.


